A 'New Zealand student' is any New Zealand citizen, including citizens or permanent residents of the Cook Islands, Tokelau or Niue studying there or in New Zealand, New Zealand permanent residents living in New Zealand, and Australian citizens living in New Zealand.

** International Students

An 'international student' is anyone who doesn't fit the description of a New Zealand student.

We can only accept you as an international student studying in New Zealand if you have a valid work permit with a Variation of Conditions that allows you to work and study part time. We cannot accept international students studying on a student permit.
